I invite you to feel with me these identities, connect with a few and perhaps see a part of yourself in one of them.


## **ABOUT** THIBAULT GAURIAU





## " Have a sit and let's talk about you! "



- In order to make sure I would approach each Identity from the most neutral point of view, every model was a stranger to me. Naturally the first step had to be an introduction and explanation of the project details and the photo shoot process. This conversation was the most crucial part of the shoot! It was the only way for me to connect with my model, feel the hidden core emotion(s) the person is made of. After the conversation, I would draft a couple of ideas for the body expression and the emotion to be united. The final step was to revert back to the model so that we can both share opinions and reactions, until both of us would find the most faithful way to represent their IDENTITY.











THE SHOOT

- A simple setup with a Key Light, a Fill and White Background.



- Following the conversation, we can now explore a few body expression as I test the light and adjust the shadows.







- Only when everything is ready and rehearsed, I begin the "painting" for the final shot.





























RETOUCHING

For IDENTITY, one key element had to be added in post-process for every photograph. It's the black line that represents **TIME.** 



- Every photograph is brought in Photoshop for a retouching post-process. That step is an essential part of my style and my art. It mostly involves color correction of white and black values, unifying the skin color, boosting some reflections, balancing the shadows, reshape and emphasis body contour. For most part, the retouching process took 3 hours to 4 hours per picture across a period of 1 month, as I would work all the pictures in parallel to maintain uniformity. This is to ensure I give enough time for my eyes to rest in order to see the photographs as often as possible with a fresh eye.
